### CONFERENCE DESCRIPTION:

In the 30+ years since FASD was first identified, children with FASD have become adults, and many are now in their 30s and even 40s. As time has passed, their changing and emerging needs have become obvious, but the areas of research, experience and front line practice have frequently functioned as separate and parallel systems, rather than intersecting ones. Focused and targeted approaches across multiple areas, services, and systems have recently begun to emerge to address the urgent need for an integrated approach to addressing FASD in adolescence and adulthood. This conference will bring together a diverse group of professionals and families to share research, experience and practice in order to sustain and enhance the lives of adolescents and adults with FASD, their families, service providers, and communities.

### CONFERENCE OBJECTIVES:

1. Continue to expand our understanding of FASD as it presents in adolescence and adulthood and its potential implications and applications.
2. Learn about current findings about adults and adolescents with FASD from scientific, clinical, and community researchers.

# Call for Presentations

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### DEADLINE FOR PRESENTATION SUBMISSIONS - September 15, 2009

**Please Note:** For Presenters of Accepted Paper Presentations, the conference does not cover honoraria, accommodation, travel or other associated expenses. However, the primary presenter will be admitted to the conference free of charge. Additional presenters and poster presenters will be asked to pay a reduced registration fee.

#### PRESENTATION SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

The abstract must be submitted through the online electronic submission form at [www.interprofessional.ubc.ca](http://www.interprofessional.ubc.ca) or by email to [ipinfo@interchange.ubc.ca](mailto:ipinfo@interchange.ubc.ca) in Word Document format (.doc) or in Rich Text Format (.RTF) using minimal text formatting. Accepted presenters should pre-suppose prior audience knowledge of FASD. Presentations will be accepted according to the following:

- Explain how your presentation meets the conference objectives.
- Indicate whether you work with diagnosed and/or undiagnosed individuals.
- Describe the nature of your approach or program that specifically responds to an identified need of the individual with FASD and how that approach can be applied by others.
- Include a listing of the learning objectives.

We are seeking presentation submissions across North America in the following formats:

**3 hour sessions:** These sessions should be as interactive as possible and address a relevant conference theme.

**90 minute sessions:** These sessions are performed by no more than a maximum of 3 presenters addressing a relevant conference theme.

**Posters:** Posters will be displayed for the duration of the conference. There will be dedicated time for poster viewing and discussion with the presenter(s). Poster board size is 4'x8' and all materials must fit within this space.

#### PRESENTATION FORMAT

The following information must be included on all submitted presentations:

- Title of presentation
- Author name(s), organization name(s), presenter name(s) (if different). List primary presenter's name first & underlined.
- Street address, city, province/state, postal code, telephone number, fax number & email address of **all presenters**.
- Specify which format style you will be using (3-hr Session/90-Minute Session/Poster).
- Please indicate the primary category under which your presentation is submitted. The categories are listed as suggestions only and are not intended to be restrictive.
- A presentation description (500 words maximum) including information as listed above (A-D), under submission guidelines.
- (Not applicable for poster submissions) Please provide a brief 50 word description of your session to be inserted into the program brochure if your abstract is accepted for presentation.
