KIM BARTHEL began her training as an occupational therapist in Winnipeg in the early 80's. With remarkable determination she started the first trans-disciplinary private practice clinic in Western Canada, and she invested every bit of her spare time learning about sensory processing and neuro-developmental treatment from the top gurus of the day.

In the late 90's, Kim moved to Nunavut where she focused primarily on mental health. Since then, she's been learning as much as she can about attachment, trauma and neurobiology – an understanding of which she'll say helps everything to

make more sense, even the most complex of behaviours.

Kim has written a few books, contributed to several textbooks and reinforces **the critical value of relationship** in everything she does. In the past 20 years, Kim has been travelling internationally as a teacher and speaker, actively supporting multi-disciplinary function and healing in many cultures. Her mission is to support the conscious evolution of the human spirit.

This workshop is designed to assist parents, teachers, caregivers, one-to-one workers and other professionals learning to support children with behavioural symptoms and learning challenges. The sensory processing approach assists in "looking beyond the behaviour" and into the nervous system. It helps with understanding the child's behaviour as a manner of coping.

Strategies in adapting the environment, altering interaction and providing appropriate supports for children who have difficulty with processing sensory information will be provided. Many children with different diagnoses experience challenges in the manner in which they process sensory information (for example, fetal alcohol spectrum disorder, learning disabilities, developmental coordination disorder, ADD/ADHD, autism spectrum disorder, cerebral palsy, and emotional behavioural disorders).
